Save time and money with Metro's regional contractor's business license

Metro's construction contractor and landscape contracting business license is honored in 20 cities

A government program that saves time, paperwork and money? Can there really be such a thing? Yes, it's called the Metro contractor's business license program and here's how it works:

If you do business in multiple metropolitan cities, instead of getting separate business licenses to operate in each of those cities, you can get a single license from Metro that lets you – as a contractor or landscaper – conduct business in those cities (Portland is excluded). The license covers all construction trades, both commercial and residential, as well as all landscape contractors.

Just one business license lets you do business in just about every city in the region

The Metro license is optional. It's strictly a matter of what's going to cost less: a single Metro license or a number of licenses from individual cities. You can do whatever makes the most sense for you. Please note, the Metro business license does not excuse you from obtaining a business license from the city in which your principal place of business is located, or where dollar limits, as explained below, are exceeded.

These 20 cities honor the Metro license:

The license does not cover the City of Portland. To obtain a business license for work performed in Portland, please contact the City of Portland for information.

To qualify for a Metro license, you must:

- be licensed with the Oregon Construction Contractors Board or the Oregon Landscape Contractors Board, unless proof of exemption is provided;
- have a corresponding city license if your principal place of business is located in any of the 20 cities honoring the Metro license; and
- earn \$250,000 or less in gross receipts per year per jurisdiction honoring the Metro license, or hold a city license for any jurisdiction listed in which that dollar limit is exceeded.

What does the Metro license cost?

To apply for a license:

Complete and mail the attached application or complete and mail an application you can download from our web site (www.oregonmetro.gov). Include the nonrefundable fee.

Use your credit card and apply online at www.oregonmetro.gov.

Applications also are available by calling Metro at 503-797-1500 and may be available at city permit counters.

As long as you meet all of the licensing requirements, a copy of your completed application or online order confirmation will serve as your temporary license. You should receive your official license in about two weeks.

The license is valid for 12 months from the date issued. You'll receive a notice inviting you to renew your license prior to the expiration date.
