January 15, April 8 and September 1.*

Translation Services

Metro provides grants to renovate the storefronts of commercial buildings. In eligible locations, projects that meet program goals may be awarded matching grants of up to \$50,000. 

STOREFRONT IMPROVEMENT GRANT GUIDELINES

Metro's Enterprising Places program is an essential tool for implementing the region's 2040 Growth Concept, which calls for focusing commercial activity, redevelopment and investment in existing downtowns and main street districts. The Enterprising Places program seeks to enhance the vitality and prosperity of downtowns and main streets to help boost economic activity, create jobs, and attract new investment.

The core mission of the Enterprising Places program is to stimulate private investment in designated commercial districts by directly engaging small businesses and property owners and jointly investing in transformational improvements. Public-private partnerships can improve vitality of downtowns and main street districts, bolster prosperity, create new opportunities for local businesses, and set the stage for future private investment that helps local communities and businesses reach their full potential. As districts mature into successful commercial centers, their strong economic performance will continue to stimulate a virtuous cycle of improvement.

Enterprising Places storefront improvement grants are offered by Metro to help property and business owners reinvest in their storefronts and catalyze the revitalization of downtowns and districts throughout the region. For qualifying projects, Metro will provide dollar for dollar matching funds in order to renovate older structures and model best practices for storefront design. Visit our web site, www.oregonmetro.gov/enterprisingplaces, to learn if your property is in an area that has been designated eligible for this program, and to see examples of the kinds of storefront makeovers that can help businesses and communities thrive.

WHO CAN APPLY?

As shown on the map on the previous page, fourteen commercial districts throughout the region are eligible for Enterprising Places storefront improvement grants. If you are in a district that is shown as eligible for the Enterprising Places storefront grant program, please refer to the district-specific map for your area to confirm if your property is located within the eligible boundary. For detailed local maps that show district boundaries and eligible properties, please visit www.oregonmetro.gov/enterprisingplaces. Business owners and property owners of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds whose property falls within designated eligible areas may apply for grants. Franchises headquartered outside the Metro region are not eligible for grants. Some locally-owned franchises may be granted special permission to apply. Government offices and public agencies are not eligible to receive grants. Adult businesses are not eligible to apply for grants.

Business owner applicants: To submit an application, a business must be located on the ground floor, and must be an active retail or restaurant use. Businesses who lease their space must have at least two years remaining on their lease or the option to renew. The applicant must have written or contractual authority from the property owner to implement building improvements. Businesses operating out of residences are not eligible, unless the residence has storefront immediately adjacent to the sidewalk.

Property owner applicants: To submit an application, a property owner must have active retail or restaurant tenants on the ground floor, or vacant space that will be leased to an active retail or restaurant tenant.

HOW MUCH FUNDING IS AVAILABLE?

The Enterprising Places program has targeted approximately \$175,000 annually to support Storefront Improvement projects in eligible districts around the region. Metro's funds must be matched dollar for dollar by the property owner, business owner or other funders. The property or business owner may obtain other grant funding, but must contribute at least 25% of their own funds for any project. The maximum matching grant awarded for any one project will be \$50,000.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- At a minimum, Metro's grant funds must be matched dollar for dollar as described above.
- Projects must take place within the boundaries for districts that have been designated eligible for the Enterprising Places Storefront Improvement grant program.
- Projects must address at least two of the Enterprising Places District Transformation project investment criteria (outlined below).
- Projects must be completed within 12 months of date of grant award, or according to the performance timeline stipulated in the grant agreement.
- Grant recipient must not be in arrears on any tax payments and must have no outstanding liens or encumbrances. Note that grant funds may be considered a gift and may be taxable. Metro reports all grant distributions to the IRS.
- Grant recipients will engage skilled professionals approved by the Enterprising Places program to assist with the planning and design of all improvements.
- Grant recipients agree to hire licensed contractors approved by the Enterprising Places program to implement projects.

PROJECT INVESTMENT CRITERIA

All applications must clearly satisfy two or more of the Storefront Improvement grant investment criteria:

- Contributes to critical mass of revitalization within the district due to proximity to significant node of activity, major district destinations, key historic buildings, and renovated and well-maintained properties.
- Potential to significantly enhance district appearance, ambience, and character
- Provides a significant destination or venue that will be an attractor for the district
- Potential to enhance an important gateway to the district
- Improves availability or viability of ground floor retail services and amenities
- Improves or facilitates placemaking, revitalization and local identity
- Attracts investment, create jobs and strengthen local tax bases
- Enhances opportunity or provides community benefit to disadvantaged individuals or populations
- Removes or addresses a significant existing blight within the district
- Potential to significantly restore historic structures
- Leverages contributions from other public and non-profit entities

ELIGIBLE TYPES OF IMPROVEMENTS

All types of storefront renovations that directly affect the facades of buildings facing streets, sidewalks, and public areas. This includes windows, entryways, signage and lighting, awnings, canopies, cornices, gutters, downspouts, painting, finishing and detailing of façade surfaces. Design costs, permits and fees associated with the implementation of these improvements are also eligible project expenses.

Structural upgrades, accessibility improvements and upgrades to heating, ventilation and air conditioning may be eligible expenses if storefront improvements necessitate modifications to existing conditions. Limited permanent interior improvements such as floorings, ceilings, interior lighting, and accessibility may be eligible if part of a larger project involving significant exterior upgrades.

INELIGIBLE TYPES OF IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements to buildings less than five years old. Roofing and foundation work. Billboards and electronic signs. Security systems and bars. Window coverings and window tinting. Non-permanent fixtures, unless they are part of a larger project involving storefront and branding upgrades. Improvements to sidewalks, parking lots and back alleys.

STOREFRONT IMPROVEMENT GRANT APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

PRE-APPLICATION

Interested property or business owners should complete, and submit a Grant Pre-application Form (found on page 7) in order to initiate the application process.

A confirmation email will be sent when the application is received. If you do not receive a confirmation, please contact Lisa Miles at 503-797-1877.

INTERVIEW AND SITE VISIT

Once Metro receives your pre-application, Metro staff will contact you to arrange an interview and site visit. Metro staff will visit you at your property or business to your project and to confirm the general alignment of your project with Enterprising Places program goals. Staff will have the opportunity to answer questions you may have about the program requirements. Staff will also assist in identifying the project approach that might best fit with program criteria, and will relay upcoming deadlines for submitting your full application for review by the Enterprising Places steering committee.

FULL APPLICATION

Please do not complete the full application form until after you have submitted a pre-application and have had the opportunity to meet with Metro staff. Once the pre-application interview and site visit have been completed, follow the instructions below to complete your full application. To be considered by the steering committee, applications must be received ten business days prior to a scheduled committee meeting.

Full applications must be submitted in paper form, and must have original signatures. Mail or deliver the completed application to:

APPLICATION REVIEW AND SELECTION PROCESS

Applications will be reviewed by the Enterprising Places Steering Committee. In 2016, the steering committee is scheduled to review applications in February, May and November. Applications will be evaluated based on the information submitted, responsiveness to the program's purpose and goals, Storefront Improvement investment criteria, and the committee's professional and collective judgment. The steering committee will select which applications to recommend to Metro's Chief Operating Officer for funding.

The Enterprising Places program has targeted approximately \$175,000 annually to support Storefront Improvement grants. As limited funds are available each year for the entire region, the committee will be looking for projects that meet a number of the program criteria, and will help Metro to demonstrate best practices for revitalization.

CONTRACTING AND GRANT AGREEMENTS

If Metro approves funding, Metro staff will work with the successful applicant to enter into the necessary agreements for the project between Metro and the applicant. The applicant will have up to 12 months from the time these agreements are signed to complete the project, unless a different performance timeline is approved at the time of grant award. The requirements and obligations of the applicant, as well as the timeline and process for grant funds to be disbursed, will be spelled out in the grant agreement.

Applicants who receive funding shall enter into a contractual agreement with Metro that specifies legal and contractual obligations, including insurance requirements. Appropriate insurance coverage levels for each project will be considered at the time of grant award, and coverage of applicant will be reviewed prior to entering into a grant agreement.

Funds may not be pre-committed prior to a completed and signed contractual agreement; improvements completed prior to an executed grant agreement cannot be applied as matching funds and will not be reimbursed. Grant projects are subject to Metro audits and reviews, and may require that property owner records are retained for up to six years, depending on amount of grant. Metro and the Enterprising Places program shall be acknowledged as grant sponsors on any written or published material, grant product and/or project signage.

Applicant must be making reasonable progress towards the project milestones and in accordance with the performance timeline established at the time of the grant award. A final evaluation report will be due upon project completion.

ABOUT METRO
