In total, Portland'5 expects these updates to produce an electricity savings of 415,653 kilowatts per hour and a natural gas savings of 7,900 therms. Looking forward, Portland's is working to cut down on solid waste by providing patrons with fully-recyclable cups and continuing implementation of more efficient climate control systems. Portland'5 will also be participating in Energy Trust's 2016 Strategic Energy Management program to identify new strategies for further reducing energy use.



Portland'5 presents

While Portland'5 venues have typically served as rental facilities, Portland'5 began presenting events independently for the first time in FY 2014-15.

The 17 events Portland'5 presented over the course of the year allowed the venues to diversify income streams, expand business opportunities, welcome new and emerging performers, and engage new audiences.

From the Director

The Portland region is a vibrant place for arts and culture, and Portland'5 Centers for the Arts play an important role by hosting performers from down the street and around the globe.

Our mission is to foster homegrown creativity and talent by supporting our resident companies and other non-profits while also presenting shows that appeal to our diverse community. In FY 2014-15, we hosted over 750 performances by local arts organizations. We also hosted popular national acts including The Book of Mormon, Bob Dylan, John Oliver, and Neil deGrasse Tyson. In total, 879,335 visitors attended over 970 performances, and thousands more experienced music, art, and poetry in the streets at our free events.

In an important new move, Portland'5 put on a presenter's hat to increase the diversity of its audiences and events and present shows that had previously not performed in Portland.

We have also taken steps to reduce our impact on the environment by installing new climate controls and LED lighting throughout our venues.

FY 2014-15 was a remarkable year, and we thank our partners in the arts, government and community for helping us maintain our mission.
