

# Parks and Nature Sponsorships for Community-led Activities Fall 2019

## **BIPOC Family Retreat**

**Recipient:** Transformative Living Community, International

Sponsorship amount: \$3,500

**Program summary:** TLC, Int'l will organize an opportunity for families and friends of color to connect and commune with one another in a natural environment. People of color often do not feel safe camping alone, this large group setting will provide a greater sense of security.

## **CCC Community Building Retreat**

**Recipient:** Coalition of Communities of Color

Sponsorship amount: \$3,410

**Program summary:** CCC will host a retreat for member organizations at Oxbow Regional Park. This will be an opportunity for knowledge sharing and community building among organizations.
