

## 2040 PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT GRANTS PROGRAM AWARDS MADE FOR GRANT CYCLE 8 IN 2020

Metro received 12 grant proposals for the 2020 grant Cycle 8. The Cycle 8 review process was streamlined in response to direction from Metro Council to increase and expedite grant funds to support local jurisdictions and community partners during the economic crisis arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. In May 2020, Metro Chief Operating Officer Marissa Madrigal approved grant awards for all Cycle 8 grant proposals and authorized an increase in the total pool of funds available for all cycle 8 grants from \$2 million to \$2,695,200.
