Compost, native plants and hand-weeding tools

For a list of participating stores, see other side or visit oregonmetro.gov/gardenshops. Limit one coupon per customer per store. Requires a \$20 minimum purchase before discount. All eligible products may not be available at every store. Expires 12/31/2022.



Bring a load of household toxics, like **pesticides and cleaners**, and Metro will waive the usual \$5 fee. The maximum load size is 35 gallons. This coupon is required for a fee waiver. Expires 12/31/2022.



Detox the home

Use less toxic products in and around the home. Chemicals in items like paint, pesticides and antifreeze can harm our health, air and water. Fewer harmful chemicals means better air quality and a less toxic environment.

Ask Metro how you can:

- Improve soil with compost.
- Attract pest-eaters and pollinators using native plants.
- Use tools, not toxics to remove weeds or pests.
- Save money by making your own safe cleaning products.
- Safely dispose of home and garden chemicals at one of our collection sites.

Simple ways to detox the home

- Clean green: Cleaning without harsh chemicals is simple, safe and effective. Try making your own cleaners with recipes from our website at oregonmetro.gov/healthyhome.
- Get rid of harmful products you don't **need:** You can bring old stuff to your local hazardous waste station. Call 503-234-3000 to find out where the nearest facility is.
- Buy healthy products: At the store, look for short ingredient lists that contain fewer harmful chemicals.
