

2040 PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT GRANTS PROGRAM AWARDS MADE FOR GRANT CYCLES 8 AND 9 IN 2020

Metro received 12 grant proposals for grant Cycle 8. In May, 2020, COO Marissa Madrigal approved the award of \$2,695,200 of grant funding to support twelve projects across the region. In July, 2020, the Metro Council allocated \$1.5 million in additional grants to respond to economic development needs and provide additional support for equity-related initiatives across the region.
