DESCRIPTION

Provide traffic direction on, around and off the site at Metro Transfer Stations within a team. Provide safe traffic management, inspect loads for prohibited and suspicious waste.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES

This is the first level in the series. It is distinguished from the Traffic Control/Load Inspection Technician II by performing in an entry level position; learning and understanding the basis for load inspections, acceptance or rejection and proper direction to the tipping areas.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Manages lines of traffic at transfer stations to drop off waste materials.
2. Visually inspect loads for prohibited and suspicious waste.
3. Receives, reviews, approves and consolidates documentation require for acceptance of Construction and Demolition wastes.
4. Provides public education on appropriate disposal of problematic materials and recyclable materials.

It is the responsibility of all Metro employees to:

1. Actively participate on committees and/or attend meetings as assigned.

3. Perform assigned duties during an emergency situation.
 4. Perform other duties as assigned.

Duties require incumbent to work indoors and outdoors, subject to inclement weather.
