<sup>1</sup> Councilor Waker was appointed to the MSD Council effective January 27, 1983. He then served as the duly elected representative of District 2 in the May 1984 Primary election.

<sup>2</sup> Councilor Etlinger's ill health created a vacancy on the MSD Council in 1984 (he passed away on May 22, 1984); Larry Cooper, who was elected to the District 10 seat in the May 1984 Primary election, was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Bruce Etlinger. He was sworn in on June 7, 1984.

<sup>3</sup> Councilor Bonner resigned from his District 8 position in February 1986; the vacancy was filled through the appointment of John Frewing effective February 27, 1986.

<sup>4</sup> Councilor Oleson resigned from his District 1 position effective October 1, 1986. Mike Ragsdale who was elected to the District 1 seat in the May 1986 Primary election, was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Bob Oleson for the period October 9, 1986 to January 4, 1987. He then served as the duly elected representative from District 1 from January 4, 1987 to July 1, 1990.

<sup>5</sup> Councilor Myers resigned from his District 9 position effective June 30, 1986; the vacancy was filled through the appointment of Tanya Collier effective July 10, 1986. Councilor Collier was then elected to fill the unexpired term of Hardy Meyers on November 4, 1986.

<sup>6</sup> Councilor Kafoury resigned from her District 11 position effective November 13, 1986. David Knowles who was elected to the District 11 seat in the May 1986 Primary election, was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Marge Kafoury for the period November 13, 1986 through January 4, 1987. He then served as the duly elected representative from District 11 from January 4, 1987 to January 10, 1992.
