









2030 Regional Waste Plan

Program history

Three year pilot, launched in 2018



I&I program purpose and objectives

Purpose: Reduce disposal of materials through waste prevention, reuse and repair, and material recovery. Advance racial equity in the solid waste system.

Objectives

- 1. Reduce harmful environmental and health impacts
- 2. Advance equity
- 3. Build system resilience
- 4. Catalyze innovation

Grant types for 2023

- **Program grants:** \$10,000 to \$100,000
 - Personnel, operations and equipment
 - 20% match (nonprofits exempt)
 - **Capital grants:** \$50,000 to \$500,000
 - Equipment and facility infrastructure
 - 100% match (nonprofits exempt)



Who can apply?

- Non-profit organizations, for-profit businesses, colleges and universities
- Projects must take place in the Metro region or have a significant direct impact on waste generated in the Metro region



2023 grant cycle overview

- \$2M total available for both grant types
- Updated priority focus areas
- Equity requirement
- Two-stage application process
- Provisions specific to nonprofits



Priority focus areas

- Reuse and repair
- Food waste prevention and rescue; transition to reusable food service ware and packaging
- Recycling infrastructure







Equity requirement

- All grants must demonstrate a commitment to racial equity – minimum threshold to be eligible for funding
- See proposal handbook pages 8-9 for details



Use of grant funds

- Only expenses during grant term: 18-months, beginning August or September 2023
- Eligible costs: staff salaries, materials, supplies, equipment, consultants/contracted professional services, and up to 10% for overhead expenses

Disbursement of grant funds

Three installments:

- 1. 50% after contract is signed (likely September 2023)
- 2. 40% after reporting how first installment was spent
- 3. Final 10% on a reimbursement basis, after Metro receives and approves final grant report

Proposal review criteria

- Waste stream, environmental and/or human health impacts
- Racial equity impacts
- Project plan and capacity to execute it
- Budget
- How you will evaluate impact



Application process

- Pre-proposals are due in ZoomGrants by Thursday, Feb. 23 at 5 p.m.
- Responses to pre-proposals will be sent on or around April 10 (invitations or declines)
- Full proposals (by invitation only) are due in ZoomGrants by Monday, May 22 at 5 p.m.

Application process (continued)

- Grant awards announced end of July 2023
- Contracting in August and September 2023
- Spending period: 18-months starting upon contract signature (likely September 2023)

Investment and Innovation grants support efforts to prevent waste and reduce waste through reusing, repairing, recycling, or composting in greater Portland.





Metro's Investment and Innovation grant program supports for-profit businesses, nonprofit organizations, and colleges and universities involved in creative efforts to prevent waste or







