Function as a member of the zoo dive team working closely with animal keepers, volunteers and the Dive Safety Officer (DSO) in the care of habitats.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES

The diver performs routine dive husbandry assignments to support animal welfare.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Assist Marine Life Keepers, DSO and volunteers with routine cleaning of aquatic environments utilizing established diving practices.
- 2. Assist with feeding, care of exhibit animals and life support system maintenance.
- 3. Review and updates dive and animal husbandry logs.
- 4. Maintain a clean and orderly back of house work area.
- 5. Be familiar with Oregon Zoo Dive Policy and adhere to established policy.
- 6. Be familiar with Oregon Zoo Emergency Policies and Procedures.
- 7. Maintain and inspect dive equipment and gear.
- 8. Utilize power equipment such as pressure washer-powered scrubbers and suction pumps.
