






Powell Boulevard (Willamette River to Burnside Rd)



Regional Role:

- Links west side to east county for all modes including freight
- Connects historically underserved communities
- TriMet identifies Powell as a key corridor to increase ridership including eventual High Capacity Transit (HCT)


Local Role:

- Main street for numerous formal and informal commercial centers
- Provides access to and between numerous community areas
- Provides local access and circulation to residential and commercial areas
- Transit access to a diverse range of communities


Safety: SE Powell

2007 - 2016 data

- <u>18 Fatalities including 12 walking and 1 biking</u>
 - 15 in Portland (10 walk)
 - 3 in Gresham (2 walk/1 bike)
- 117 Serious injuries including 21 walking and 15 biking
 - 83 in Portland (14 walk/10 bike)
 - 34 in Gresham (7 walk/5 bike)

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Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Projects

- Inner Powell: signal and crossing improvements for pedestrians and bikes, median island with trees, redesign select intersections for ped/bike safety and stormwater treatments
- Outer Powell: widen to 3-4 lanes with sidewalks, buffered bike lanes, improve safety and access to transit
- Gresham: improve intersections with 182nd and Eastman, adding turn lanes and supporting transit. Eliminate left turns at intersection with Burnside
- RTP Transit Strategy, High Capacity Transit (HCT) Plan

Current Local Opportunities: Gresham

 Added N/S left turn lanes at intersection with 182nd/Highland


\$3-5M

Added northbound lane at Hogan

- \$6-8M
- Two-way bikeway on north side of Powell from Main to 1st \$3M



Bidirectional Bike Lane Example




Current Local Opportunities: Outer Powell

- Funded project: adding center turn lane, sidewalks, bicycle facilities, and drainage
- Construction for 122nd Ave 136th Ave will be complete in 2020

\$110M (funded)

- Phase 2 (99th –174th Ave) will continue these improvements
- Corridor will transfer to PBOT upon completion



Current Local Opportunities: Inner Powell

- Ongoing: ODOT state of good repair study (ADA improvements, utilities, signals, pavement quality, crossings) for SE 9th Ave— SE 99th Ave
- tbd

 Funded: Improved neighborhood access to transit (crossings at 47th, 57th, 61st, 79th)

\$2M (funded)

 Completed: Safety and crossings at 21st, 24th, 26th, 28th, 31st, 34th, and 36th

\$4M (completed)

Current Local Opportunities: Transit


Inner Powell

- Minor transit enhancements were studied on Inner Powell and found to be expensive and ineffective
- Powell-Division BRT project concluded that an effective project could not be done without elevating or tunneling in Inner Powell
- Too much traffic, space is too constrained



Transit – Requires Major Investment

- A large investment is needed to serve Inner Powell
 - high ridership potential for LRT or BRT
 - Constrained environment requires elevated or tunnel
 - Planning needed to identify mode, terminus, design, environmental impact study (EIS): \$15M



A major investment would be needed to work on Inner Powell.




Half-signal or midblock signal




Powell Boulevard (Western Portion) (Willamette River to 82nd Ave)

Identified Issues and Opportunities:


- Safety issues throughout corridor
