
# **Corridor evaluation map**

# Identifying projects and opportunities

- First: 2018 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) project list
- > Second: Local planning or agency programs

Is there a project or project concept in the local TSP or local plans on a corridor? Is there project or project concept developed as a focused program? (e.g., ODOT Leverage program, Enhanced Transit Concept program)

> Third: Opportunities on the corridor

Is there an <u>opportunity</u> to link projects across the corridor, or meet outcomes along the corridor by linking or extended project boundaries?

### Project readiness and need

#### **Project Readiness**

- Planning
- Design
- Construction

#### **Project Need**


- High-level cost estimates
- % of project that is or might be funded by local, state or federal sources
- % of project that could be eligible for federal funding, e.g., FTA Small Starts

#### Readiness and risk factors

High-level scoring on readiness

Examples of readiness factors:


- Environmental review
- Quality of scoping and cost estimate
- Right-of-way analysis/work
- Complexity of project
